



Color Palettes

Instructions for use

1) Place a small amount of gel in a dappen dish...

Pigmented gels are designed for use as a final coating on top of existing gel or acrylic nails. You will need only enough gel to *thinly* coat the surface of the nails.

If you have mixed more colored gel than you need and wish to save the unused portion, we suggest that you use a re-sealable container that will not allow the gel to be exposed to light during storage.

2) Mixing the pigment into the gel...

Take the tip of an orangewood stick, or the edge of your gel brush and dip into your still uncolored, wet and sticky gel.

Next, dip into the pigment of your choice, picking up just a bit of colored powder.

Now, stir the pigment into your dish of gel with the end of the brush or stick.

NOTE: Too much pigment will make the gel too thick and dense with color. This will prevent the gel from curing. Use just enough so that the gel is not "see through" when in the mixing dish. If the gel does become too thick and dense with pigment, simply add some more gel to balance things out.

3) Applying colored gel to the nail...

Making sure the surface of the existing overlay is free of any uneven spots or shine, apply colored gel as you would polish. Thin and even strokes.

Allow any brush strokes to settle out prior to curing under the light.

Allow the colored gel to cure for 2 minutes in a 6-watt light
or 1 minute in a 9-watt light.

If more intense color or better coverage is desired, apply a second coat and cure.

Apply a final coat of CLEAR gel on top of the colored gel and cure for 2 minutes in a 9-watt light **or** 3 minutes in a 6-watt light.

Remove sticky residue with a lint free nail wipe saturated with non-acetone polish remover, alcohol or "Wipe-Out".

NOTE: Follow same basic guidelines for use of GLITTER PALETTES. Glitter and pigment can be combined within your gels for a unique and custom look.
